The raffles, kits, doll sales, doll sponsorships and donations contributed to an overall total of \$1869.


Thank you everyone for your assistance and enthusiasm. This always makes Craft Show such an enjoyable and profitable way to promote and showcase the Uthando Project.



SURPRISE VISIT OF CEO OF DLALANATHI TO HQ FORRESTFIELD, FRIDAY 27 AUGUST

Words don't do justice to the amazement blazing out in our HQ in Forrestfield when Julie Stone, the Founder of Uthando Project left the expectant crowd and returned with the beaming Rachel Rozentals-Thresher who is the inspirational CEO from Dlalanathi in Pietermaritzburg, KwaZulu Natal. Rachel had to hide around the corner until she was called in. It has been 10 years of great partnership between Dlalanathi and Uthando, providing each other with genuine love for what the other provides and sustains in communities. Julie spoke warmly about all that the huge numbers of dollmakers give of themselves unselfishly. She said "Thank You "and spoke about the loving importance of play for children everywhere.

Rachel brought a wrapped gift to give to Georgia (really for everyone) to acknowledge 10 years of the funds raised by Uthando which aided the magnitude of growth for Dlalanathi. These funds specifically enabled Dlalanathi to have a trained psychologist, Zulu speaking, who would be the trail blazer for their transformative community work. We were overawed by the discovery that the total funding had reached \$230,000. Thousands





of generous hearts have gathered this money. Thank you.

The gift was unwrapped to reveal a wonderfully detailed commissioned painting of a KZN community corner where there was evidence of the presence of Uthando dolls everywhere - on the roof, on a sign, on a box hiding a doll, dolls left to continue the game with a basin and rolled up paper chair, a mother swinging a doll aloft. The painting captured the joy of having a doll and playing. It showed happiness.


