2707 dolls sent in April to KwaZulu Natal

They will arrive at TREE (Training and Resources in Early Education) in Durban later in May to give delight and comfort to many, many children.

How did we achieve so many dolls in such a short time?

It was because the success of the "Make a 100 Dolls in a Day" series of events for Harmony Week really worked!!!!! It forms a foundation for similar challenges to be created at any time, any where, with any number of dolls being made as the goal.

In 7 days, Uthando held 5 workshops using two smaller, simpler doll patterns and finished over 400 dolls, with lots more nearly finished and being delivered later.

Each event brought in new people meeting the Uthando Project and accomplishing a doll immediately. We also had the warmth of "old" Uthando dollmakers joining in.

For everyone who took part, from stuffers to face makers, a huge thank you, including the coordinators of the different venues so we could be in different quarters of the Perth Metropolitan area.

It is fabulous to see the strength of the independent groups delivering their bags of unique dolls already packed.

This shipment included approximately 4 full bags EACH from Albany, Bunbury, Hamilton Hill, schools, with from Sorrento the amazing number of 3 bags from the general dollmakers, 8 bags from Lyn Fisher and Marcia Watson and one bag from Pauline Groom and the Western Dollmakers, and then, the gathering of many dolls at Gooseberry Hill to fill 9 bags. Add to this, but posted directly, were 3 bags from Julie Timewell's group in Melbourne.

Special mention must be clarioned about the consistent dollmaking generously done in schools. Mater Dei College, in Edgewater, for the third year, has fulfilled an order of 200 dollmaking kits, with great results from boys and girls.

There are many other schools who participate year after year, or through an enthusiastic teacher taking the project with them to their next appointment. The project then reveals many layers of awareness and skills for dollmakers of all ages. Thank you to all schools.

Next shipment will be finalised Monday 24th August.

Please note, that we never sell dolls which are intended to go to Africa. It is valuable for our present day children to have a doll representing another culture.

However, if your exhibition dolls do not sell, it would be a bonus to send them to Africa too, unless you prefer them returned.

Please read the next part avidly to see how you may be able to contribute or who you know who may provide African artefacts for sale for an extraordinary event.

Note that the demonstration items pictured here are only representing possibly similar exhibition items.

Kidogo Arthouse is one of Fremantle's favourite historic landmarks with ample, simple space, right beside the Indian Ocean. It can symbolise the point of departure for dolls being shipped to Durban.
